- Safety is at the forefront
- Manny shared draft
- The breadth if the plan is how we move to keep kids safe
- Manny shared screen and committee reviewed draft
- Manny discussed safety issues

- Child abuse: mandated reporters discussed
- Disaster procedures
- Suspension and expulsion policies
  - 2 kinds:
    - no intention to hurt
    - more severe with intention to harm
- How we notify teachers
- Discrimination
- District Dress code
- Procedure for entering/exiting school campus
- Orderly environment/emotional as well
- Discipline
- Hate crimes

Meagan Baichtal asked a question regarding multiple expulsions.

• The way the state determines reports regarding expulsion does not track how many times the student is expelled.

## 3. PBIS:

- A. The goal of PBIS: restorative practice/how to avoid expulsion, help students make better choices
  - Some actions are automatic expulsions
  - Riego creek has zero expulsions
  - Positive atmosphere for learning
  - PBIS training for staff
  - Monthly meetings
  - Team is 2 teachers/psychologists
  - Launch plan in January
  - Riego Raptor's "ROAR" PBIS
    - 4 expectations

# **B.Incentives**

- Student store
  - Dino dollars
  - Students buy prizes
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Teachers put name into weekly drawing  $\;$
  - Monthly student of the month
  - Manny doing recordings
  - Teachers write positive; put on facebook
  - Behavior tracking system
- C. Change mindset-goal: How do we support kids and teach them how to behav?e
  - 2 levels
    - Minors-minor reminder
    - Second-contact parents
  - We will be sending PBIS videos to parents
  - This year is tier 1: just launching
    - Getting used to it before tier 2
  - Parent buy in-look at positive rewards
  - Not punitive

- 4. Survey: discuss ideas/hot topics that we should address: some we can change, some we can not.
  - Goal: to create an annual survey to find out:
    - $\circ$   $\;$  How stakeholders feel things are going
    - How students feel about PBIS/
    - Overall well-being
    - What programs and culture makes us Riego Creek

### Incentives

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  - Change mindset-goal
    - How do we support kids and teach them how to behave
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### 6. SAFETY: Keeping all areas safe:

- A. Objectives/action steps/resources
  - Maintain parking lot safety
    - Post staff
    - Send home safety procedures
    - Before and after school
      - Explicit coming and going parking lot procedures
      - Safety patrol kids/weather walking/bridge:group of parents walking kids to school
- B. Collecting incidences about parking lot
  - Kelly Frisch commented on issues with the area near the exit.

- The committee discussed the difficulty this area poses due to parent parking. When drivers are turning right while parents are walking across.
- Manny responded:
  - The city will make one side of the street a non-parking side; signs will be posted after the new year
  - Manny offered to monitor this area
  - "Right turn only" sign a possibility
- Kelly asked for clarification regarding the windows in the kinder building facing the street with a concern about safety.
  - Manny responded that all windows have shades/working blinds. All kinder rooms are connected.
- Accommodations were discussed on doors. All doors can be locked from the inside and outside for emergencies.
- C. How do we stay on top of fire drills/3 earthquake drills one shooter drill
- Red backpacks in each classroom
- Fire drills: numbers on blacktop for kids
- Do video to show kids to avoid anxiety
- Keep track of anxiety
- Lock down drill sometime in March
- Kinders are not participating but kinder teachers do the participate.

#### Discussion:

- Linda Ramsey commented about code Red:
- Suggested that classrooms have 5 gallon buckets, garbage bags, bottled water and hard candy on hand for drills.
- •
- Kristin Medina asked if windows were able to be opened. The concern being ventilation and covid. Manny responded that there is an upgraded ventilation system and super filters.
- •
- Mathew McPhell commented about the parking lot and drop off locations for busses:
  - Keep in mind the landscaping will evolve in time and each month it might change.
- Manny responded that because there are no bus riders the bussing issue will be dealt with at a later date.
- The park was mentioned as another exit option.

### Additional safety issues:

- Goal: only 25% of classroom walls should be covered due to fire hazards.
- C02 monitor in each room
- Fire alarm pulls
- All staff have radios
- The safety team is led by Mrs. Zan and Mrs. Wickwire.
